

Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Milldown Primary Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- *Access to high quality coaching in a range of sports.*
- *Professional development for staff to enable them to teach PE more effectively*
- *Specialist teachers and coaches to broaden the pupils' experience of other sports.*
- *Additional PE resources to support the delivery of high quality*
- *Provided a range of Extra-curricular clubs to develop skills and broaden children's experiences.*
- *Implemented and installed a daily mile track for all children to participate on.*
- *Enter a variety of different competitions and festivals for children to participate in.*

Impact Report for Last Year

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year (2022/23) was: £18,210. This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below.

Swimming booster sessions	£2300	<p>Year 3s swimming for 2 terms.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Baseline - 0/29 children were able to swim 25m. - End - 14/29 children were able swim 25m - All children made some improvements.
To provide sports coaching as part of School's Sports Week.	£2500	<p>The week provided the children with experiences of such a range of sports for example rock-climbing, canoeing, horse riding, archery, bowls, handball, rugby, orienteering, cricket and more. The aim of this week was to show children that there are many sports available in our local area, to give them an opportunity to try something that they may have never experienced and to promote the many different ways to take part in a physical lifestyle.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>I'm not someone who really enjoys sports that much, but I really enjoyed getting to try something new like skateboarding and rock-climbing. They are things I've never done, so I was a bit nervous at first but it was so fun!</i>

Transport to and from sports fixtures throughout the year	£660	<p>This has allowed more children to attend sporting events with some events being attended by two teams instead of one. More children have been involved in competitive sports outside of lesson time.</p>
Purchase a sports kit for the children to wear at sports fixtures.	£300	<p>Our school sports teams are proud to be a part of the team and wearing the school kit. <i>"I feel prevailed to have worn the new Milldown team kit as not only does it show we are a team, but we have our school name on the back so makes proud to be part of the school too."</i> Children are more motivated to want to be picked for a team and therefore attend more clubs/try harder to be part of the team. <i>"I feel honoured to be chosen for sports fixtures and the fact we get to wear the new kit makes this even more special."</i></p>
Purchasing sports equipment throughout the year.	£2500	<p>Has helped to ensure that the teaching of PE is effective and with safe equipment. Ensure that any equipment is updated so that it is long lasting. As a result of having sufficient equipment for the whole class, children were more active as they were not waiting for equipment to be free.</p>
Outdoor Gym	£1985	<p>Outdoor gym area. Aim is to increase participation in physical activity during break and lunchtime, promote active lifestyles and can be used to support a fitness club after school.</p>

Action Plan for Current Year 2023/2024

Our Sport Premium Funding for the current academic year is: £18,050. The following plan details how we plan to use the money to maintain and improve provision.

Activity	Budget	Anticipated Impact
Outdoor Gym	£4932	Outdoor gym area – planned for October half-term 2023 – Aim is to increase participation in physical activity during break and lunchtime, promote active lifestyles and can be used to support a fitness club after school.
Swimming booster sessions	£2500	To provide booster top up lessons to those who do reach the minimum requirement to ensure as many children as possible reach the expected level before leaving primary school. To provide self-saving sessions for Year 6 children.
Purchasing sports equipment throughout the year.	£2500	To help ensure that the teaching of PE is effective and with safe equipment. Ensure that any equipment is updated so that it is long lasting and can enhance the experience of PE.
To provide sports coaching as part of School's Sports Week.	£2000	Improve opportunities and experiences to Children, look to inspire new and long term participation via different sports clubs and links during the week including some disability sports.
Provide cover for teachers to monitor, assess and provide sports week activities and sports day.	£500	Ensure monitoring of outside providers and consistency across school. Monitoring of the budget spend. Provided smooth running of Sports Day events across the school.
Transport to and from sports fixtures throughout the year	£1000	Provide more opportunities for competitive sports in and around Dorset.
Specialist sports coaches in to support 1 day a week with teachers.	£5508	Support our two new members of the school who are also ECTs in the delivery of PE. This will help support the implementation of our new 'mastery lesson design' to our staff and will help to ensure the teaching of PE is of a high quality.
Total Budget spend	£18,040	

Monitoring and Evaluation
